Overall GPA should be a 3.0. High school applicants must be admitted to a four year college; college applicants must be working toward their Bachelor of Arts or Graduate degree and must write a 500 word essay for SALEF. SEARS CRAFTMAN SCHOLARSHIP

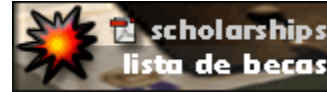

“We encourage all students to seek private scholarships for their educational expenses. Please keep in mind that in order to qualify for state and federal financial aid, students must be legal permanent residents or citizens. If a student is not yet a legal permanent resident, they should look to private scholarships to help with educational expenses. The majority of the scholarships on this list do not require a social security number, legal residency, or citizenship. As a general rule, if an application asks for your social security number and you do not have one yet, leave that space blank but fill out and turn in the application. Lying about your legal status or providing a false social security is a federal offense. Family savings and fundraising can also supplement educational costs.”

PRINT AND GRAPHICS SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION

The directors of the Print and Graphics Scholarship Foundation take pleasure in announcing the annual national competition for approximately 300 scholarships to be awarded for professional and executive careers in the graphic communications industry. To be eligible to compete for a scholarship award, the student must be: Interested in a career in graphic communications. A high school senior or a high school graduate that has not yet started college. A college student who is enrolled in a two- or four-year college program. All scholarship students must be full-time students. Scholarships are not awarded for part-time study. The candidates are judged on the basis of their high school/college academic records, rank in class, recommendations offered from counselors, advisors, teachers, and biographical information, which includes extracurricular interests and academic honors.

Unless otherwise specified, scholarships are renewable annually. Students must maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA, continue at the school in which they originally enrolled, and continue to major in graphic communications. If a student's grades fall below 3.0, funds will be withheld.

HARVARD UNIVERSITY - accepts non-resident students with scholarship and financial aid

From email from Brigita Gahr - bgahr@fgcu.edu I contacted Harvard University, one of best private universities in the United States (located in Massachusetts) to inquire about non-resident students. They may apply to Harvard and they would be considered for institutional financial aid. Parents are not expected to contribute towards college expenses if combined family income is less than \$60,000. If a student is accepted into Harvard, it is possible that the university would pay up to \$41,200 a year of their school-related expenses. The current annual cost of attending Harvard is \$46,450. Even if awarded the maximum amount of financial aid from Harvard, students are expected to contribute at least \$5,250 on their own through work, loans, etc. Nevertheless, \$5,250 is a lot less than what out-of-state students pay at Florida public universities!

Harvard website: <http://www.harvard.edu/> Harvard prefers that high school seniors apply by Dec. 15th, but the official application deadline is Jan. 1. If an applicant has not yet taken the three required SAT II subject area tests- they can do that on January 27. Note that Harvard does require that students who take the ACT include the writing portion. The SAT I already includes the writing section, whereas the ACT makes it optional. The regular SAT deadline to apply for these tests is Dec. 20th. You can pick up an SAT registration booklet in your high school guidance office, if you do not have one already. If you decide to apply to Harvard, you need to take action **IMMEDIATELY**. Look over the application carefully to see what you need.
