- The Association also provides professional development for its members, ensuring the effectiveness of HEPs and CAMPs.



2015 Performance

- 66.6% of HEP students earned a HSED credential
- 78.2% of the HSED graduates were placed in upgraded employment, post-secondary education/training or military.
- 86.7% of the CAMP students successfully completed the first year of college
- 96.2% of the first year completers continued into the second year of college

Where is CAMP



What is CAMP?

- The College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) was established in 1972
- CAMP assists farm-worker students in successfully completing their first academic year of college and to continue at a postsecondary education institution
- CAMP grantees provide academic support, stipends and other support services necessary to ensure that students succeed in college.
- CAMP serves over 2,000 migrant participants annually
- Overall, nearly three-quarters of all CAMP students graduate with baccalaureate degrees

General CAMP Admissions

- Student or immediate family member must have engaged in migrant or seasonal farm work for at least 75 days within the last 24 months. <u>OR</u>
- They have participated or been eligible to participate in the Title 1C Migrant Education Program.
- Has qualified for the Workforce Investment Act 167 Program (WIA 167), formerly the JTPA 402 Program


Specific CAMP Criteria

- Must be a legal resident or US citizen
- Attend college as a first-time freshman status.
- Be a full-time student at the university/college
- Demonstrate academic, financial or transitional support need

What is HEP?

- The High School Equivalency Program (HEP) was established in 1967
- The programs are funded through competitive grants from the U.S Department of Education, Office of Migrant Education and are administered by universities, colleges and non-profit organizations nationwide
- HEP helps farmworker students obtain a HSED credential and, subsequently, begin postsecondary education, enter military service, or obtain employment
- HEP serves more than 5,000 students annually

General HEP Qualifications

- Applicant or eligible family member must submit verification of having within the past 24 months:
 - Spent a minimum of 75 days conducting eligible migrant or seasonal farm work; or
 - Participated or been eligible to participate in Title 1- Migrant Education Program (under 34 CFR part 200, Subpart C); or
 - Participated or been eligible to participate in Employment and Training Admin., Department of Labor--Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Programs (under 20 CFR part 633)
- Not be enrolled in school or have a high school diploma
- Be at least 17-years old (16 with court order)
 Satisfactory scores on academic assessment
